Listed below are ACHC Renal Dialysis Accreditation Standards revised to incorporate 2023 guidance updates from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). Summaries of the changes and effective dates are provided. ACHC annually reviews all program standards and makes periodic revisions to keep you up to date on current best practices for your organization. Renal dialysis facilities must maintain compliance throughout their entire accreditation period.

Qualifications, training, and competency expectations for anyone who administers dialysis treatments to nursing home residents. Presence of a qualified dialysis caregiver in the room to monitor the dialysis patient's status throughout the entire duration of the dialysis treatment. 		and intervene as necessary.Coordination of care through communication and patient management.	
RD6-A	HDS, ICD	Revised to include a requirement to continuously monitor the renal dialysis facility's performance of home dialysis services provided to individuals who receive dialysis treatments in a nursing home. Data collected supports the facility's Quality Assessment and Performance Improvement (QAPI) program.	October 10, 2023
